History

The site of the MIT Endicott House has a distinguished history dating back to the late 1800's. Brigadier General Stephen Minot Weld, a Civil War hero, built a stunning mansion on this site, after the war. Using rock found throughout the property, he also created what is considered the first great rock garden in North America. Weld's heirs sold the property to Frances Saltonstall, who in turn sold it, in 1931, to a descendant of another prominent Massachusetts family, H. Wendell Endicott. Endicott razed the Weld mansion and replaced it with a French Manor style home. He lived there with his wife and three children until his death in 1954. The Endicott family donated the estate and twenty-five surrounding acres to MIT, which opened the Endicott House as a conference center in 1956. To this day, many of the Endicotts' rare paintings, antiques, and fine furnishings remain in the halls and rooms of the Mansion.

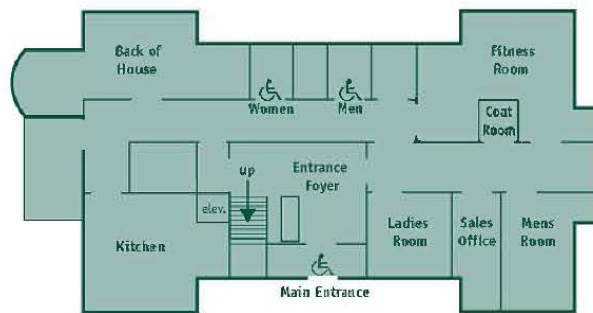




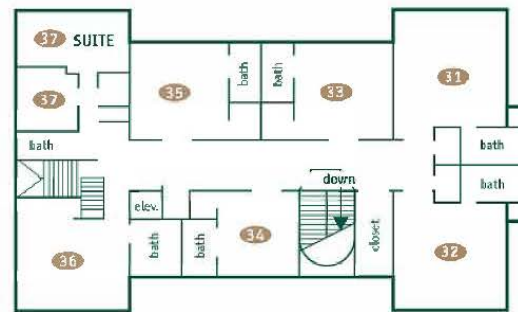

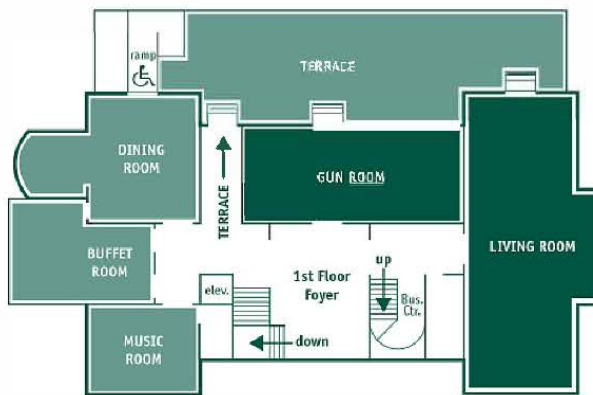
Living Room



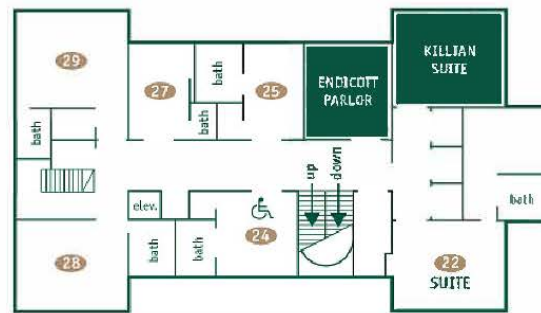
GROUND FLOOR

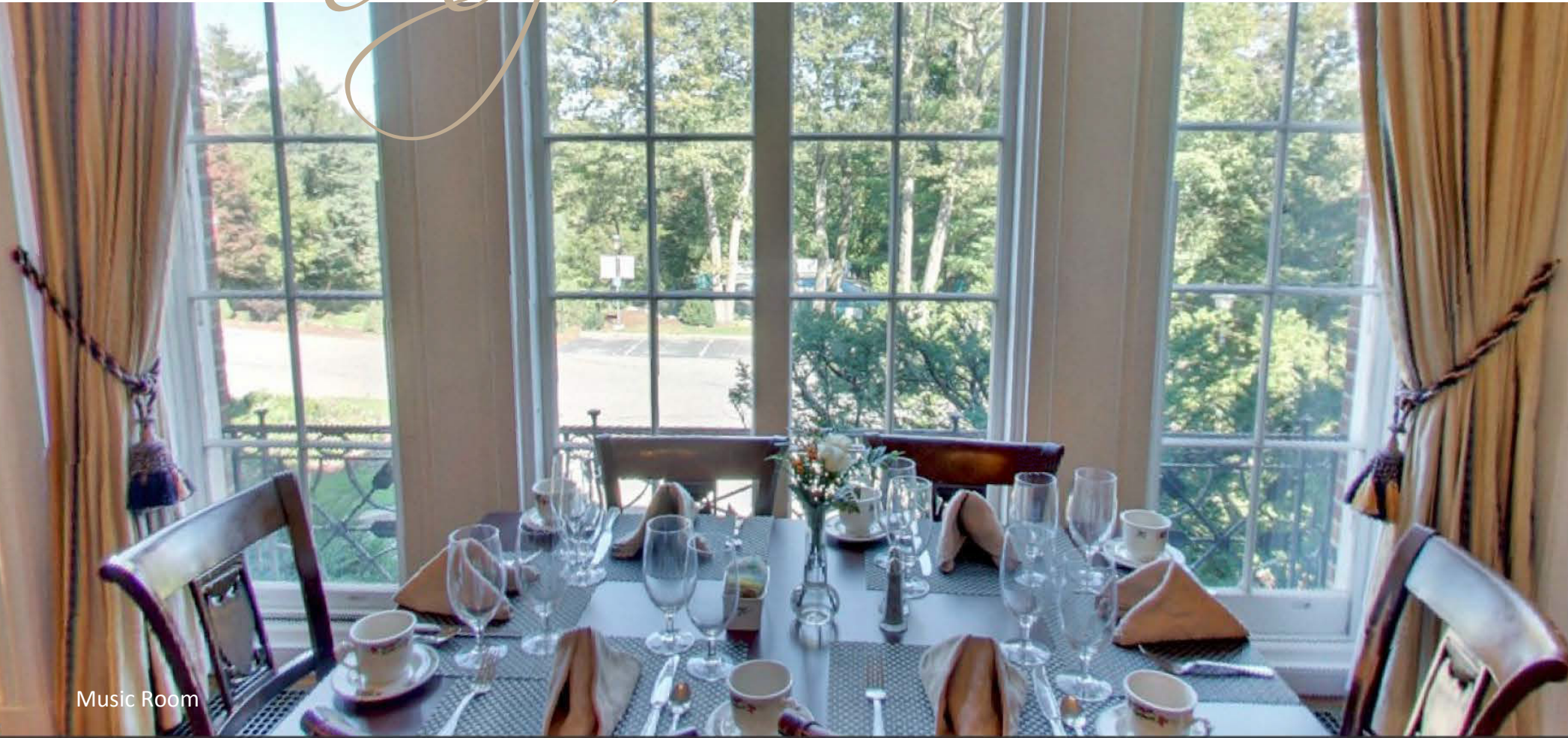
